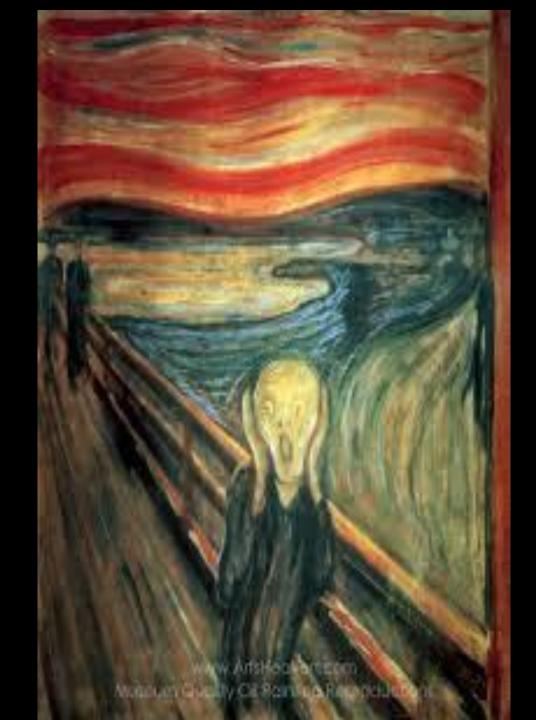
ANGER AND KABBALAH: CONFRONTING DIVINE AND HUMAN RAGE THROUGH THE ZOHAR

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If you're not angry,

you're either a stone or you're too sick to be angry. ...

You must not be bitter.

Bitterness is like cancer. It eats upon the host.

So use that anger. You write it. You paint it. You dance it.

You march it. You vote it.

You do everything about it. You talk it.

Never stop talking it.

Rambam - "Anger is a Very Evil Attribute"

> Mishneh Torah, Hilkhot De'ot 2:3

הכעס מדה רעה היא עד למאד וראוי לאדם שיתרחק ממנה עד הקצה האחר וילמד עצמו שלא יכעוס ואפילו על דבר שראוי לכעוס עליו

Anger is a very evil attribute.

And it is fitting that a person distance himself from it all the way to the other extreme.

And he should teach himself not to get angry even over something about which it is fitting to be angry

אם רצה להטיל אימה על בניו ובני ביתו או על הציבור אם היה פרנס ורצה לכעוס עליהן כדי שיחזרו למוטב יראה עצמו בפניהם שהוא כועס כדי לייסרם ותהיה דעתו מיושבת בינו לבין עצמו כאדם שהוא מדמה כועס בשעת כעסו והוא אינו כועס

And if he wishes to instill fear into his children and the members of his household, or into the public if he was a community leader, and wishes to be angry with them so that they will return to the good: he should show himself to them as if he were angry in order to distress them. But his mind should be calm within himself – like a person who appears to be an angry person in his anger, but he himself is not angry.

> Rambam, Hilkhot Yesodei Ha-Torah: 1:11

וכיון שנתברר שאינו גוף וגוייה יתברר שלא יארע לו אחד ממאורעות הגופות ...ולא כעס ולא שחוק ולא שמחה ולא עצבות

Since it is clear that He is Incorporeal, it clearly follows that none of the corporeal changes happen to Himno anger and no laughter, no joy and no sadness

> Talmud Bavli, Shabbat 105b - anger and idolatry

קרע בגדיו בחמתו והמשבר כליו בחמתו... יהא בעיניך כעובד עבודה זרהאמר רבי אבין מאי קרא "לא יהיה בך אל זר ולא תשתחוה לאל נכר"? איזהו אל זר שיש בגופו של אדם? הוי אומר זה יצר הרע

He who rends his garments in his anger,
he who breaks his vessels in his anger...:
regard him as one engaged
in alien worship [avodah zarah]! ...

Rabbi Abin said: What verse [proves this]?

"There shall be no alien god [El Zar] in thee; neither shalt thou worship any foreign god [El Nekhar]" [Psalms 81:10].

Who is the alien god [El Zar] that resides in a man's body?

Say: this is the Evil Inclination.

Anger and Character

> Babylonian Talmud, Eruvin 65b

אמר רבי אילעאי בשלשה דברים אדם ניכר בכוסו ובכיסו ובכעסו

"Rabbi Elai said: A person be recognized through three things: his cup, his pocket, and his anger [koso, kiso, ka'aso]."

Good Anger?

> Babylonian Talmud, Ta'anit 4a

ואמר רבא האי צורבא מרבנן דרתח אורייתא הוא דקא מרתחא ליה שנאמר הלוא כה דברי כאש נאם ה'

And Rava said: this young Torah scholar

[literally, one who burned by the rabbis]

who is angry

[literally, who is boiling],

it is the Torah that makes him angry

[literally, "makes him boil"],

as is said, "Is not my word like fire, says YHVH" (Jer. 23:29)

> **Zohar I, 184a**

there is anger

and

there is anger;

there is anger

that is blessed from above and below . . .

and there is anger

that is cursed above and below

Anger as Demonic Possession of the Divine Image

Zohar: II:182a-b (Daniel Matt translation, slightly modified)
פַד בָּרָא קוּדְשָׁא בְּרִיךְ הוּא לְבַר נָשׁ, עָבֵד לֵיהּ בְּדִיּוּקְנָא עִלָּאָה,
ונָפַח בֵּיהּ רוּחָא קַדִּישָׁא,

When the blessed Holy One

created the human being,

He fashioned him

in the supernal image,

And infused him with the Holy Spirit

ָוְאִי הַהִּיא נִשְּׁמְתָא קַדִּישָׁא אָעִיל לָהּ בְּפוּלְחָנָא אַחָרָא, הַאי אִיהוּ מַסְאִיב לָהּ, ... וְנָפִיק מִפּוּלְחָנָא דְּמָארֵיהּ.

If one conducts that holy Soul into alien worship,

he defiles her

and abandons the worship

of his Lord....

If we see a person, ...how can we determine whether to approach him or avoid him? By his anger he is really known, and recognized for who he is.

If, in a moment of anger, he maintains that holy Soul

– not uprooting her from her place

so as to supplant her with that 'Alien God' [Psalms 81:10]

this is a fitting human being,
 this is a servant of his Lord,
 this is a consummate man.

> And if that person does not maintain [the Soul] uprooting this supernal holiness from its place in order to supplant it with the Other Side – this is surely a person who rebels against his Lord, and it is forbidden to approach him or associate with him.

ָלְדָא אִיהוּ (איוב יח) טֹרֵף נַפְּשׁוֹ בְּאַפּוֹ. אִיהוּ טָרִיף וְעָקַר נַפְּשֵׁיהּ, בְּגִין רוּגְזֵיהּ, וְאַשְׁרֵי בְּגַוֵּיהּ אֵל זָר.

This one is called 'he who tears his soul in his anger' (Job 18:4) –

tearing and uprooting his soul on account of his anger,

and enabling an 'Alien God'

to dwell within him....

Whoever joins with him or speaks with him is like one who joins himself to alien worship [avodah zarah]. Why? Because alien worship tangibly dwells within him. ...

ַאַל תּפְנוּ אֶל זָר....דְעָקַר קְדוּשָׁה עָלָאָה מֵאַתְרֵיהּ, וְשָׁארִי בְּאַתְרֵיהּ....אֵל זָר. מַה אֵל זָר כְּתִיב בֵּיהּ (ויקרא יט) אַל תּפְנוּ אֶל... הָאֱלִילִים, כְּגַוְונָא דָּא, אָסִיר לְאְסתַּכְּלָא בְּאַנְפּוֹי:

For he has uprooted supernal holiness from its place and supplanted it with ... an 'Alien God' [El Zar].

As it is written of an 'Alien God':

'Do not turn to [lit: do not face] the idols' (Leviticus 19:4),

In the same manner:

It is forbidden to look at his face....

And if you say: what about the "anger of the rabbis," which is thoroughly good?

For we have learned that the Torah is a fire...

The "anger of the rabbis"

concerns matters of Torah

and seeks to give honor to the Torah....

But in all other things,

anger is not for the service of the blessed Holy One,

for of all sins that a person might do,

none is more like idolatry than anger.
